Three variations of the "contact" criterion

1. direct
 2. indirect (e. g., floors on either side of a wall)
 3. inferential (e. g., across loci separated by baulks)
-
- strata may also have a name or definition (e. g., subdivision within s4 for different floor surfaces); these definitions use extra-referential criteria
 - a pit is defined by a cut, and if it is not seen at first, it may be inferred, e. g. f15 is a pit seen only in s5, but it belongs inferentially to s4
